All pupils in Class 1 have enjoyed our topic of 'In to the Woods'. They have taken part in sensory stories, created lots of woodland art work and have been exploring natural materials. We can't wait to see where this school year takes Class 1!

















Pupils have been keeping fit and healthy at Fox Wood School. Members of staff from the Rebound Team have completed Rebound training and are supporting pupils within their class group to access Rebound on a regular basis. Each pupil who accesses Rebound is working towards an award and pupils are gaining skills and proudly showing progress. Rebound has many benefits, such as, communication, freedom of movement, relaxation, fun and enjoyment. Two members of staff have completed advanced Rebound training and are working with pupils from their class on advanced techniques. New Rebound permission/ medical letters have recently been sent home, please send them back as soon as possible. Pupils who are unable to access Rebound have access to other forms of physical and sensory input. Identified pupils will soon be able to access Sensory Swimming weekly. If your child is accessing Sensory

Swimming, information will be sent home by class teams, so look out for this. All pupils have access to Sensory Kingdom on a weekly basis. The sensory based classes use this time as an opportunity to have physio and take care of their sensory needs. The more formal learners use Sensory

Kingdom to support their Sensory Steps and help build social skills.







At home life skills challenge!

Here are 5 ideas for Fox Wood pupils to be developing in a variety of life skill areas at home.

Fine motor skills – screwing bottle tops on and off, manipulating dough (baking), prewriting/writing skills Personal care – dressing/undressing skills, tooth brushing, hair brushing, contributing to their personal care Safety- practicing road safety, stranger danger, safety in the bathroom/kitchen, understanding what is and isn't edible

Emotions- discovering a variety of emotions, exploring other's emotions, exploring/identifying own emotions using a mirror

Communication - exploring a variety of communication methods, practice a new way of communicating, practice the best communication method for you, practice requesting etc.

Class six hosted a PMLD awareness day on Friday 25th September. We made a Power Point presentation to explain to pupils what the term means and to recognise how students have succeeded in overcoming individual challenges as well as celebrate all their successes and abilities. We made multi-coloured sensory bottles and wore bright clothes to celebrate our differences. We raised £62 which we have put to good use by ordering some shadow boards to be used in the Multi- Sensory room with pupils. Class six would like to thank everyone for wearing their fabulous bright clothes and helping to purchase resources to enhance our sensory curriculum.



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Relationships Education, Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) and Health Education

From September 2020 the delivery of Relationships education, Sex and Relationships Education and Health Education has changed. At Fox Wood School, we have always delivered statutory relationships education, relationships and sex education and health education in a sensitive, age and developmentally appropriate manner. As pupils progress through school, they are encouraged to build on skills, relationships, feelings and emotions. The curriculum is cyclical so pupils will visit topics throughout their school lives.

During the primary phase, pupils work on 'Relationship Education' which teaches about friendship, happy, healthy relationships and where to go for support if needed. As pupils transition into Key Stage 3, the primary curriculum is built upon and ensures that relationship and sex education is accessed in a developmentally appropriate manner.

Throughout this 'Health Education' is also taught which will give information that pupils need to make good decisions about their own health and wellbeing, recognise issues in themselves and others when they arise and seek support as early as possible.

The scheme of work that we use to deliver PSHE, Relationships Educations, Relationships and Sex Education and Health Education is written by the PSHE association for pupils with SEND. The Relationships Education, Relationships and sex education (RSE) and health education policy is available on the school website if you require any further information, or call school and I will be happy to speak to you.
