Although our 'Santa Dash' looked a little different this year, we still had plenty of fun! Santa paid a visit to school (complete with his own sleigh and festive tunes) and very kindly gave a gift to each child. He even had some elf helpers from Class 9. Classes enjoyed a festive walk on the Green Mile, completed a 'Christmas Trail' and in the afternoon, were treated to hot chocolate, gingerbread men and rocky road. It was great fun!









Friday 10th December was Class 7's Awareness Day, focusing on Rett Syndrome and Fox G1 Syndrome.

Class 7 worked hard to plan the day for all classes and provided everyone with a range of activities including art, music, well-being and forest school during the day, to help them learn and understand more about both conditions.

Rett Syndrome is a rare genetic disorder, seen mostly in girls, and Fox G1 Syndrome is an extremely rare Neurodevelopmental disorder seen in both boys and girls. Both conditions affect brain development and function and impact on many areas of life. We have pupils at Fox Wood School who are diagnosed with both of these conditions, and just within our school, we know each pupil to be affected differently and that life experiences are unique in every case.

Fox Wood pupils were invited to wear something that makes them unique and celebrates them "Being Awesome" for being themselves and just who they are!

#### **Keeping Safe**

To support the Safeguarding provision at Fox Wood School, we have designed a child- friendly safeguarding programme for all of our pupils. Keeping Safe is a programme drawing on elements of the NSPCC's 'Keeping Safe Programme' and is a safeguarding programme for children at Fox wood School.

Throughout the Spring Term, pupils will embark on a six week long programme which will bolster their confidence and self-esteem while beginning to equip them with the tools they need in situations that are unsafe. The programme will encourage pupils to make good choices in tricky situations and aid them in recognising different types of abuse. Pupils will begin to develop strategies around how to deal with abuse (both in others and in themselves) and how to recognise if their own or other people's actions are appropriate or inappropriate. The programme is written for Fox Wood School, and as such, is adaptable and suitable for all pupils – being stage appropriate and delivered in a fun, engaging way.

The programme is six weeks long and will cover topics such as computer and internet safety, age ratings on computer games/ films, how it feels to hear arguing, looking after our mental health and our feelings, self confidence, self awareness, saying no, secrets, inappropriate touching, communicating and where to get help sexual harassment, sexual violence and online sexual abuse.

#### What a week we had!!

Thank you for the orders that were gratefully received. Pupils worked tirelessly to get them out on time. Everyone can have a well-deserved rest over the festive period and look forward to planning a visit out and about with the profits they made.

During this week pupils also developed knowledge and understanding of the equality and diversity across our school by looking at other faiths, how we are all unique and gained understanding about the International Day of Person with Disabilities Day.
